

Model essay for Road access to a city hospital in 2007 and 2010

The two maps show how the road access to the city hospital has changed from the year 2007 to 2010.

Overall there are many improvisations held in the facilities over 3 years. The bus stop was converted into a bus station, car parks for staff and the public were separated, and roundabouts were established.

There was a ring road around the city hospital which was connected by the hospital road to the city road in 2007. In 2010, there were two roundabouts installed at the junctions of the hospital road that is between the ring road and the city road. On the two sides of the hospital road, there were 6 bus stops that existed back in 2007. But, in 2010 it was replaced as a single bus station on the west side of the hospital road.

In 2007, there was a car park for both city hospital staff and the public on the southeast side of Ring Road. That car park remained only for staff and a new public car park was built on the east side of the road.
